Refuse and recycling

Collections every Tuesday morning (Wednesday following a Bank Holiday). Weeks alternate between collection of purple refuse sacks, containing waste for landfill, and the next for recycling boxes, with separate boxes for paper/cardboard and glass/plastic/aluminium. Also in recycling week, garden waste is collected in large green or blue bags, for which St Albans council charges an additional annual fee, identified by a purple sticker on the bag. - Ye Olde Fighting Cocks, Abbey Mill Lane. Tel: 01727 869152. Allegedly the oldest pub in England!

Churches

- Fishpool Street is divided between two parishes the boundary is on the bend near No. 60. The
 top half belongs in the parish of St Albans Cathedral and Abbey Church, containing the shrine of
 St. Alban, the first English martyr circa 250AD.
- The lower half lies in the parish of St Michael's Church, a small church founded in 10th century.
- There is also The Independent Chapel in nearby Spicer Street.

Ideas for local walks

Gorhambury. Access via road from Bluehouse Hill into the Gorhambury estate by the side of the Roman theatre. The drive is not always open to the public but this will be indicated on the gate.

Alban Way – a disused railway line. This is a trail for cyclists and walkers starting in Cottonmill Lane and ends at Wrestlers Bridge in Hatfield (6.3 miles). Information can be found at www.sustrans.org.uk.

Ver Valley Walks – these are 8 loop walks following the river from its source near Markyate to the confluence with the River Colne in Bricket Wood. See www.riverver.co.uk for information.

Sports

Westminster Lodge Leisure Centre, sited in the park at the foot of Holywell Hill – with two swimming pools and a water confidence area, a 4-court sports hall, a 200-station gym, two group exercise studios, a group cycling studio, an indoor climbing wall, children's soft play area, café and crèche. Museums

Verulamium Museum – off St Michael's Street. First class collection of Roman life and artefacts. Verulamium Roman Theatre – on Bluehouse Hill. One of the few Roman theatres in the country. St Albans City Museum and Gallery – based in the Old Town Hall. The tourist information centre is located there, with leaflets available to cover all local facilities and events.
